Justice Department Targets Health System Consolidation as Detrimental to Economy

When Associate Attorney General Vanita Gupta spoke at the 15th annual Global Antitrust Enforcement Symposium at Georgetown Law School this month, she emphasized the department's focus on preventing monopolies, and called out healthcare. "Dominant health systems can approach 50 percent control of a relevant local or regional market. This kind of consolidation can be detrimental to our economy," she said.
